The Royal College of General Practitioners has developed a Green Impact for Health Toolkit which aims to help general practice improve their sustainability and environmental impact; reduce their harmful impact on planetary health, the risks of climate change and reduce their practice expenses.

The NHS have developed a campaign toolkit to empower NHS staff to build a more sustainable NHS. The staff campaign is built around the creative platform, 'Healthier planet. - Choosing sustainable goods and services
